Club Policy - Photography and Video

Prestwich Cricket Club is keen to promote positive images of children playing cricket and is not intending to prevent the use of photographic or videoing equipment, it simply wants to ensure photography and video footage taken within the Cricket Club is done so appropriately.

Parents should not be prevented from taking pictures of, or filming, their children. These are normal family practices and help mark milestones in a child's life. The introduction of proportionate controls on the use of photographic equipment (cameras, and videos, including mobile phones) is part of general safeguarding good practice in a club. We all need to be vigilant, to ensure that some people do not use sporting events as an opportunity to take inappropriate photographs or film footage of children.

- Photographs / Images / Video are not to be taken at matches or training without the prior permission of the Parents / Guardian of the child. This permission can be given by proxy by the coach of each team only after parental consent for this has been granted. The coach must arrange this prior to attending matches
- Consent should be given to the coach on the team and recorded so the appropriate person(s) taking photographs or Videos are made aware.
- All photographs and videos should be appropriate
- Specific Photographic or Video equipment should not be brought onto the club premises, for the purpose of Photographing / Videoing Children, without the permission of the Club.
- No Photographs / Videos shall be publicised via any electronic media without prior permission of the Parents / Guardian of the Child. Please refer to the Club E-safety Policy for further information.

Failure to comply with any of these requirements may result in the person involved being asked to leave the club or having their Membership of the Club revoked.
